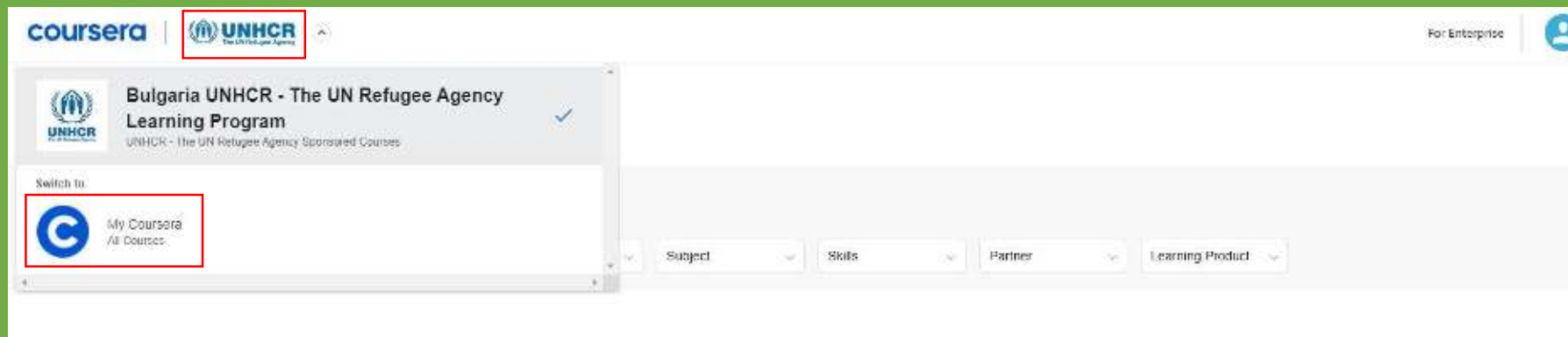


Starting a Course

Start dates are suggested to keep you on track—you can reset them if things get busy.




